Camp runs Monday–Friday, 9 am–4 pm. Campers are placed in groups according to grade level and group requests. Camp Butwin programs are based on grade your child is **entering** in fall 2012.

Club Kulanu is for individuals with developmental disabilities ages 16-22. Campers learn together as well as participate individually utilizing unique skills and abilities. Kulanu, which is Hebrew for “all of us”, utilizes Camp Butwin and opportunities in the community to help participants learn about and experience activities in four key areas:

Job Skills: responsibilities and behavior on the job, performing jobs at camp, volunteering in the community

Recreation & Leisure: work out at the JCC fitness center, attend cultural events, visit local attractions

Community Participation: grocery shopping, scheduling an appointment, accessing transportation

Home Living: cooking, healthy nutrition, laundry, emergency preparedness

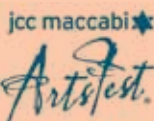

Registration policies and procedures

- Registration for all programs is first-come, first-served; space is limited
- A \$75 deposit must accompany camp registration to be applied to your camp payment
- A \$30 deposit must accompany Before/After Camp Care registration to be applied to your final week of care
- There are no refunds for absences
- All camp fees must be paid in full by Friday, June 1
- Registrations received after Friday, June 1 will incur a \$50 late registration fee and must be paid in full

Billing and Payment

There are three payment options:

Option 1: Payment in full by credit card

Option 2: Electronic Fund Transfer of three equal payments: (May 1, May 15, June 1) Voided Check Required

Option 3: Credit card charges of two equal payments: (May 1 and June 1)

Cancellation policy

- If cancellation is received prior to April 1, 2012, your full camp fee less the \$75 deposit is refundable
- If cancellation is received April 1- June 1, 2012, 50% of your camp fee less the \$75 deposit is refundable
- After June 1 there will be no refunds.
- Deposits for Before and After Camp Care are non-refundable after April 1

Log-In

You need a St Paul JCC login ID and password to register for camp.

Go to www.stpauljcc.org and click the login link at the upper right corner.

Returning users: Enter your e-mail address and password.

New users: Follow the instructions to create a new user account.

After Log-In

Click on the summer camp box at the bottom of the St. Paul JCC website homepage.

Follow the on-screen step by step process, reading all instructions carefully.

- Select a camper from the list of all family members eligible to attend Camp Butwin/CIT
- Click "Select" to choose a session
- Enter grade for September of 2012
- Enter the green security code and click continue

Registration Form

- Enter all information about your camper that is not automatically filled in.
- If needed, register for Before and After Camp Care (grades K–6)
- Choose a payment option (one per family) and download and print the payment option authorization form to sign return to the St Paul JCC by April 13
- Read and agree to terms, conditions and fees information
- Click continue

Verification

- Verify your camp registration and fee information
- Click “Edit” button to go back and change information or click “Final Confirmation/ Continue”
- You will not be able to edit or cancel after Final Confirmation.

Repeat for Each Child Payment

- After all registrations are complete, click “Continue PayPal Payment Process”.
- When you have reviewed the instructions, click “Pay with PayPal Now.”

A secure payment site will open in a new window or tab.

- Choose your method of payment (credit card or through your PayPal account)
- Follow the prompts on the screen.

Your registration will not be complete unless you click “Return to St Paul JCC” button.

- You will receive an e-mail confirmation from both PayPal and the St. Paul JCC.

Fee Reduction

Financial assistance is available for families who find the full cost of membership and/or camp difficult to manage. To arrange for a confidential interview, please check the fee adjustment box on your online registration form and you will be contacted for an appointment. All applicants must provide proof of income (2011 taxes, W-2 forms) at the time of the appointment to be considered for camp scholarships. Request for fee adjustments are due by April 15 and are available for JCC members only.

Policies for leaving children at JCC facilities

- Children 7 and under must be actively supervised by a parent/adult guardian (18+) at all times.
- Children 7-12 must be participating in a scheduled program/activity or be accompanied by a parent/adult (18+).
- Youth ages 13 -18 may use specific JCC facilities without an adult present.
- Youth ages 13 -15 who have completed the Fit 4 Teens program have full use of the Fitness Center.

Inclusion and accessibility for participants with disabilities or special needs

The St. Paul JCC welcomes, supports and includes children and teens with disabilities in all of our camps and programs.
